If you are building a new home, you must obtain a receipt/invoice for the equipment from your builder or retailer. Rebates for new homes must be negotiated between the builder and new home buyer to determine who will receive the rebate. Quality Installation rebate only available for existing homes, new homes do not qualify for this rebate.

# Qualifying account holders

Xcel Energy electric residential account holders in Colorado are eligible for rebates when buying qualifying, high-efficiency, central air conditioners or air source heat pumps.

Account holder equipment must be purchased from and installed by a contractor who is currently registered with Xcel Energy's High-Efficiency Cooling Rebate program, as listed on xcelenergy.com/cotrades.

Participants understand they are not eligible to receive a rebate for this improvement earned under a different Xcel Energy rebate program.

## Installing and testing the equipment

In order to verify that the AC equipment has been properly installed, the contractor must commission the system by performing tests related to airflow and refrigerant charge. These tests can only be conducted when the outdoor (ambient) temperature is at 67° F or higher. If using FDSi tool, the minimum testing temperature is 60° F. Rebate applications may not be submitted until the equipment has been fully commissioned.

There are no acceptable alternative testing techniques for creating a commissioning environment. If the weather is too cool, the contractor must return in warmer weather to complete the rebate application's QI section. The customer will still be eligible for the rebate as long as the completed application is submitted before July 31 of the following year.

The rebate is paid according to the lesser value of the SEER/EER. Example: A system with 16 SEER and 12.5 EER will receive a \$350 rebate.

#### Qualifying equipment

The trade-in rebate is dependent upon the new equipment 1) being installed by a registered AC contractor, 2) having a qualifying AHRI (Air Conditioning Heating Refrigeration Institute) certificate, 3) being installed with quality installation measurements, and 4) having both trade-in rebate application fields completed.

The trade-in equipment must either be functioning at the time of new equipment purchase, or, if not working, is estimated to be repairable at a cost of \$1,500 or less. Otherwise, there are no energy savings from the unit, and the trade-in rebate is invalid. Also, the trade-in equipment cannot have a SEER rating higher than 12; anything higher is disqualified.

The new equipment must be a "matched" new system, meaning the outdoor unit (compressor and condenser) and the indoor evaporative coil are intended to work together, thus providing higher efficiency. In many instances, a matching furnace will further improve the efficiency of a system. The furnace must be accounted for on the front of the rebate form and in the invoicing IF the AHRI certificate lists a furnace. If the original furnace invoice is available, please attach it. If not, write the model number, serial number, installation date and BTUs of the furnace on the new invoice.

The proof source of the efficiency rating of the new equipment comes from ahridirectory.org, in the residential section. New air conditioning equipment must have a matching AHRI certificate in order to be eligible for the AC rebate.

No commercial units allowed. No refurbished units are allowed. Only TXV systems qualify in Colorado. Use the mini-split rebate application for mini-splits.
